

The student services fee for 2023 has been set at \$200 (GST Inclusive) per full-time student for study.

The fee funds key services for students to assist their success, retention and overall well-being while studying at Skills Premier. All domestic students must pay the fee and can borrow the amount against their student loan.

Student Services Fee (SSF)

The Student Services Fee (SSF) is an additional levy to your course fees.

The fee funds key services for students to assist their success and overall wellbeing while studying at Skills Premier. All students who are enrolled in non-degree study at Levels 3 to 7 programmes, must pay the fee and can borrow the amount against their student loan or are eligible to be funded by the government if eligible for "Fees Free Study".

What the fee covers

The fee supports the provision of the following student services:

Careers information

Advice and guidance Careers information, CV support, interview practice, internship preparation and careers counselling are all provided for the students.

There is a strong focus to support Māori, Pasifika, and those under 25 years old.

Employment information

We have links with employers and are a central point for industry vacancies and internship opportunities as part of your course. The Student Support advisors and tutoring staff also prepare the students for interviews by offering advice on speaking, clothing, and deportment.

Pastoral care

Pastoral care is provided for students and involves support with WINZ and Study link. We also provide contact information and facilitate meetings with external community or social services providers for students experiencing social, cultural, financial hardship.

Sports, recreation, and cultural activities

Throughout the year the campus holds regular on-campus student events which celebrate a cross section of cultural events embracing the vibrant and diverse ethnicities represented in our student body.

2023 fee

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Decision making process.

The current fee was set in agreement in consultation with student representatives and agreed at the Student Council Meetings held between the 11th of October and 14th of October.

Skills Premier holds regular student council meetings throughout the year and elected representatives from the student body, staff members from the academic and sales & pastoral care teams attend these meetings. Decisions are made on the use of the SSF and the fee charge for the following year is decided at these meetings collectively.
